What is this:

Earlier this November, the Bureau of Ocean Energy Management (BOEM) opened up public comments for a proposal sale notice on an Offshore Wind Farm Project in the Carolina Long Bay. We are asking union members to submit public comments to require lessees to use union labor for the construction and maintenance for this project by supporting Project Labor Agreements and developing a domestic supply chain.

Atlantic Coastal Offshore wind development is expected to generate \$140 billion in capital investments to create an estimated 85,000 new jobs by 2035. We want to make sure that these jobs in the clean energy sector will be secure and family-sustaining union jobs. **The deadline to submit public comments in January 3rd 2022 11:59pm**
